

MINUTES OF
BOARD OF HARVEY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
CANVASS OF NOVEMBER 4 GENERAL ELECTION

November 10, 2014

The Board of Harvey County Commissioners met in special session to canvass the November 4 General Election on November 10, 2014. All three commissioners were present. Chairman Krehbiel called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

Joyce Truskett, Election Officer, reviewed the general election. Harvey County has 21,498 registered voters and 11,620 cast ballots in the General Election, representing a 54.05% turnout. There were 31 UOCAVA ballots sent, of which 27 were returned. Ms. Truskett reported that although there were a few problems with some of the equipment, the election went reasonably well.

The Election Office received 232 provisional ballots, one of which was received from the Sedgwick City poll site from a Sedgwick County voter. This provisional ballot was forwarded to the Sedgwick County Election Office.

One hundred ten provisional ballots were presented for voters who moved within the county but did not change their voter registration. Commissioner Hague made a motion to approve the 110 ballots for counting. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously. When the final count of the ballots was made by Rick Piepho and John Waltner, there were only 109 ballots in this Group. Commissioner Hague made a motion to revise the number approved to be counted to 109. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Sixteen provisional ballots were presented for voters who changed their name and moved but did not change their voter registration. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to approve the sixteen ballots for counting. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Fourteen provisional ballots were presented for voters who changed their name by marriage but did not change their voter registration. Commissioner Hague made a motion to approve the fourteen ballots for counting. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Eleven provisional ballots were presented for voters who were sent an advanced ballot by mail and did not return the ballots to the election office. They went to the poll on Election Day and were required to vote a provisional ballot. The election office verified that the mailed ballots were not returned. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to approve the eleven ballots. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Three provisional ballots were presented for voters who moved within the county but did not change their voter registration. The ballots voted were incorrect because the voters were at the incorrect poll site. Therefore the ballots should be only partially counted. Commissioner Hague made a motion to partially count these ballots. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Three provisional ballots were presented for voters who received a provisional ballot because of poll worker error. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to approve these ballots for counting. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Eleven provisional ballots were presented for voters whose voter registration was incomplete because they did not provide proof of citizenship. One of these voters provided proof of citizenship before the required deadline of November 3 at midnight. Commissioner Hague made a motion to approve only one ballot for counting. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Two provisional ballots were presented for voters who voted provisional because of a clerical office error. The wrong city was listed in the Election Voter Information System. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to approve these two ballots for counting. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Two provisional ballots were presented for voters who were registered in Harvey County but had moved to another county. Commissioner Hague made a motion to not count these ballots. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Nineteen provisional ballots were presented for voters who were not registered. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to not count these nineteen ballots. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Thirty six ballots were presented for voters registered within the State of Kansas but not in Harvey County. Commissioner Westfall made a motion to not count the thirty six ballots. Commissioner Hague seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

One ballot was presented for a voter whose voter registration was cancelled due to a confirmation mailing process or felony conviction. Commissioner Hague made a motion not to count the ballot. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Four ballots were presented for voters who did not provide photo ID at the poll site as required by Kansas law. Commissioner Hague made a motion not to count the four ballots. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

One hundred fifty nine approved ballots were counted and added to the results from Election Day counts.

Commissioner Hague made a motion to certify the final results of the November 4, 2014 General Election. Commissioner Westfall seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously. Final results are attached.

The election canvass was adjourned at 9:20 a.m.
