

MINUTES OF
BOARD OF HARVEY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

June 2, 2008

The Board of Harvey County Commissioners met in regular session on June 2, 2008 with all three Commissioners present. Chairman Krebiel called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

ITEMS ADDED TO AGENDA:

Commissioner Westfall received a phone call from an individual who had a complaint about the lack of speed limit signs north of Volunteer Hall at East Lake. Commissioner Krebiel talked to Marion Rowland and Phil Adams and they will see that more signs are put up.

CALENDAR ITEMS:

1. June 10 - Special Aviation Committee meeting at the airport at 4:00 p.m.

Minutes of the May 27, 2008 Commission meeting were approved upon a motion by Commissioner Roberson, seconded by Commissioner Westfall. Motion passed unanimously.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS:

1. Merlyn Johnson sent in an application requesting putting red lights on the personal vehicle he uses when he responds to a fire call. Commissioner Westfall moved that the Commission accept the request from Merlin Johnson that he be permitted to install a safety light on his personal vehicle, seconded by Commissioner Roberson. Motion passed unanimously.
2. The NAXO meeting will be July 11-15 in Jackson County, MO. None of the Commissioners are able to attend.
3. The County received a request from Doug King of Quality Recycling to extend the agreement for the waste-to-energy plant 90 days. Commissioner Roberson moved to decline Doug King's request to extend his time frame by 90 days, seconded by Commissioner Westfall, motion pass unanimously.

Warrant checks were approved upon a motion by Commissioner Roberson, seconded by Commissioner Westfall. Motion passed unanimously.

CITIZENS FORUM:

Jim Runyan and Dan and Lisa Komarek, 8017 Chisholm Lane were in attendance to discuss the Chisholm Lane road maintenance project. Lisa asked how the Commission came up with the 90/10 split to bring the road up to standard. The split of 90 percent payment of road improvement costs being charged to the homeowners living in the north addition, and 10 percent costs being charged to the homeowners in the south addition was suggested by homeowner Eric Runyan based on the improvements made to the road by

the homeowners. There is the potential of a second petition being circulated based on the 90/10 cost split. If there is a public hearing, the landowners will be notified.

Terry Boulard and Rita Flickinger, Harvey County Health Department, presented the TAR (Technical Assistance Review) Tool plan. The County is not up to the 70% required by the Federal government's NIMS standards. Travis Everett, CRI presented the group report. Terry reviewed the outcomes specific to Harvey County and plans for the future. They would like to come before the Commission periodically to update the Commission on the progress they are making with their plan.

Craig Clough and Scott Davies presented a summary of the progress of the Dam Breach Impact Committee upon the regulation. Mr. Clough would like to adjust the 2008 appraised value for home sites in the breach impact areas. He made his presentation to make the Commissioners aware of what he is doing.

The Substance Abuse Policy and Procedures for county personnel was discussed. The Commission suggested several changes that will be included in the policy and submitted back to the Commission.

Greg Nye announced that judgment as taken on May 30 to hold a tax delinquent property sale. The legal will be published announcing that the sale will take place in the next four to five weeks.

The Commission recessed for lunch at 11:25 a.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 p.m. upon a motion by Commissioner Roberson, seconded by Commissioner Westfall. Motion passed unanimously.
